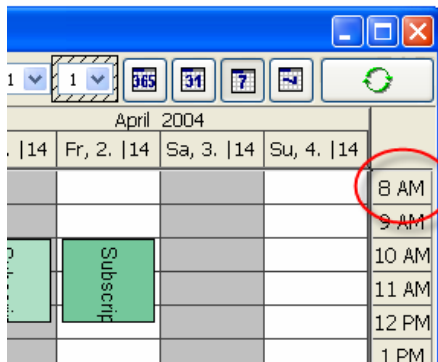


## CALENDAR CHANGES IN OPAS 8.21

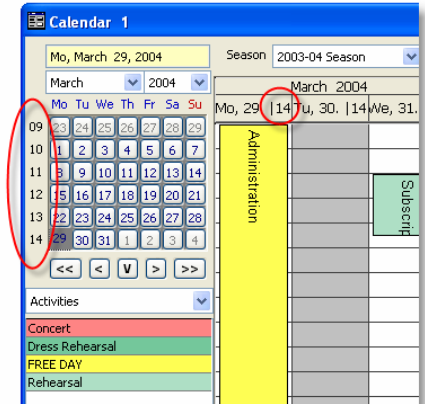
### Display Changes

The Calendar now shows the **Performance or Production Week** on the navigation calendar and on the main Calendar when utilizing the Week view

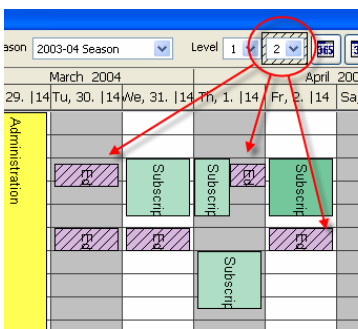
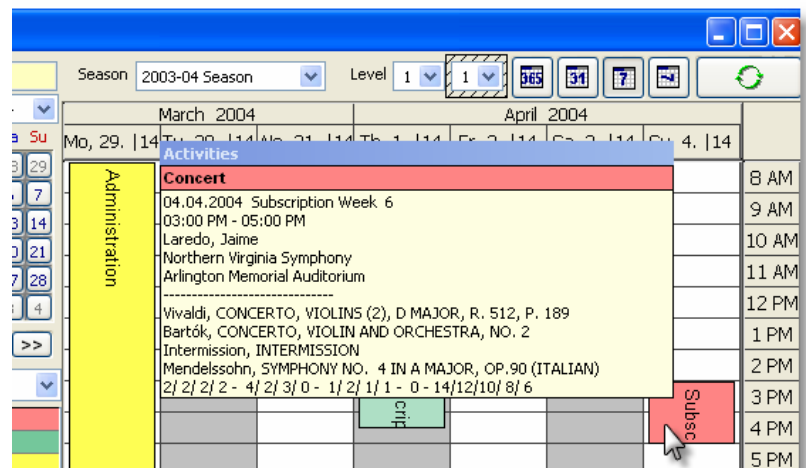


When in the Week views, the Calendar's **Start Time** can now be set in the OPAS.INI file. At the bottom of the [DATADISPLAY] Section, the following line shows the first full hour that will be shown in week views:

CalendarStartHour=8



The tool-tips or (pop-ups) that appear when you float your mouse over any activity bar now include the program and maximum instrumentation for that service:

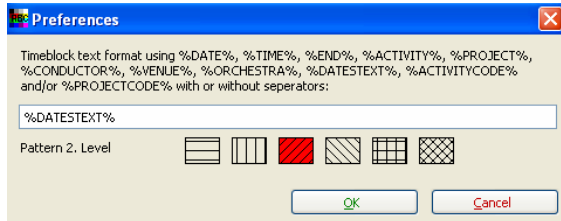
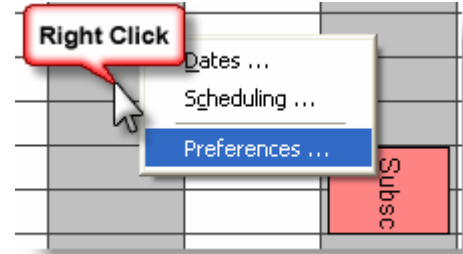


The Calendar can now show **two activity or date levels simultaneously**, including the Planning Level (level 4). The second date level is selected from the drop-down, and activities at that level are shown with hatch marks

In this OPAS database, education department activities are entered at level 2. This calendar display shows the main orchestral schedule and the education department schedule (level 2) side by side.

## Customizing text in Activity boxes

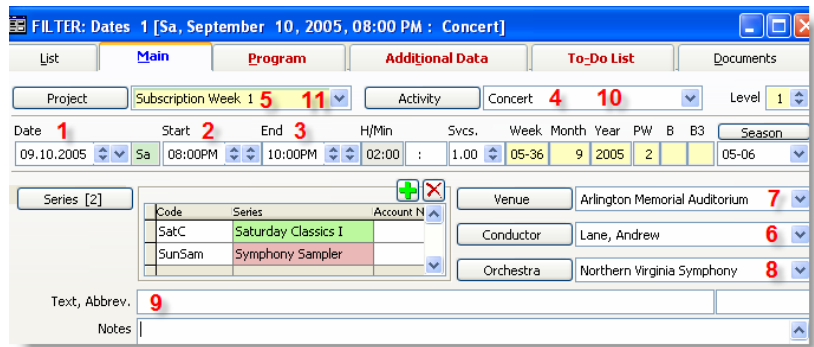
The text that fills activity bars in week views can be customized. Right-click the mouse anywhere in the calendar and choose **Preferences**.



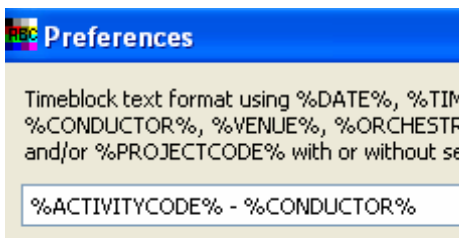
In the Preferences window, type the element(s) to be displayed, surrounded by percent signs, and separated by the character(s) of your choosing.

The elements are:

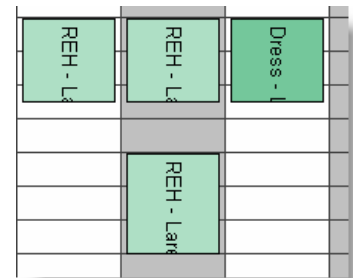
1. Date
2. Time (start time)
3. End (end time)
4. Activity
5. Project
6. Conductor
7. Venue
8. Orchestra
9. DatesText (date text)
10. ActivityCode (the Activity code)
11. ProjectCode (the Project code)



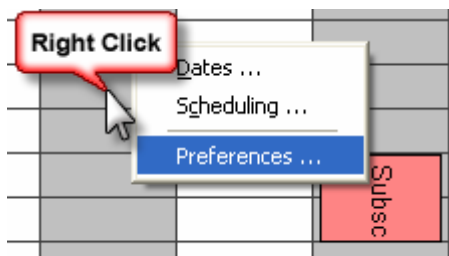
For example, this setting...



...will set each block to display the Activity code, followed by a space, a dash, a space and then the Conductor's last name.



## Setting the display pattern for alternate date levels



The Preferences window (right-click your mouse on the calendar and select Preferences) will also allow you set the pattern of the hash marks that fill the blocks of alternate date levels. The pattern in red is that which will appear in the Calendar:
